RECTOR'S BLOG: FOR LOVE OR MONEY? - "I've always been afraid of being one of those Christians. You know, the ones that talk to you about faith, but you can see the dollar signs in their eyes. I've never wanted to present the idea that people's value in God's eyes or mine would be found in their monetary worth, or their financial gifts to the Church. This fear taps into some raw feelings – for me and for others. 'Am I a commodity to God, to my priest, to my church? Is this a beloved community, or just one more place where my value is based on my performance and status?'

Last week I began a blog series about money, seeking specifically to elucidate why talking about giving to the church is so meaningful to me, even amidst discomfort and uncertainty. I laid out five major points that come up in this conversation to transform the experience into something with spiritual power. Today we'll look more fully at just the first two points: **Your God and Your Church Love You** and **You Love Your Church**."
