Help us to forgive without reservation.


Help us to love without condition.

COMMUNION PRAYER

The Eucharistic Prayer has been adapted from St. Gregory of Nyssa Episcopal Church, San Francisco.

Celebrant O Mother of our salvation.

You are worthy of blessing and praise,

- 1 You speak and creation comes to life.
- 2 You breathe and we are filled with your Spirit

You come with healing in your wings. You loosen the bonds of sickness To let the oppressed go free.

You shelter the poor and feed the hungry the bread of life. And when the night is darkest you break upon us like the dawn.

- Now we give you thanks that you have shown the greatness of your love by sending your Son Jesus Christ to share our fragile flesh and bear our every burden.
- Your Son Jesus did not turn his face from shame and loss, but took up our suffering and death.

He suffers with the sick, the injured and the dying. By his passion and death he rescued us from evil and binds up every wound.

On the night of his arrest, Jesus shared supper with his friends.

He blessed bread, broke it, gave it to them and said,

"This bread is my body, given for you and all humankind making covenant between us.

Whenever you eat it, remember me."

Then he blessed the wine and said,

"This is the cup of life, my blood poured out for all, making covenant between us.

Whenever you drink it, remember me."

Now whenever we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim the healing power of your Son by whose wounds we are healed.

Give us your power so that we may praise you and bless you:

We praise you, we bless you, and we give thanks to you, Lord our God.

We celebrate the healing power of Jesus' sacrificial death and resurrection in these gifts of bread and wine. Now send your Spirit upon them that they may become his life-giving body and blood. May Christ, the risen Son, rise in us and make us one with you, one with each other, and one with all creation. Even now Christ stands with us and in Christ's presence we see new life where our pain and sorrow is transformed into the glory of your kingdom; where with Mary, and all the saints we are bold to say,

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our trespasses,

as we forgive those who trespass against us.

And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, forever and ever. AMEN.

Welcome to The Episcopal Church of the Redeemer!
We love the sound of kids in our service.
Here are some ideas to keep them engaged:

Relax: It's OK for kids to be kids. We offer coloring pages, worship bags, and books they can use during the service.

Sit Close: Consider sitting up front where it's easier for kids to see.

Explain: Kids are curious! Explain what's happening in the service.

Participate: Kids learn by mimicking what you do. So sing, pray, respond, etc. and kids will follow your lead.

Wander: It's OK to move around. Sometimes it's easier to let fidgety kids wander.

Need to Leave? No problem, there are spaces to take a break - kids need that sometimes. Come back when you're ready!

Ask: Questions or need help? Just ask our ushers.
